### A New Bibliography of the Victoria Press

What follows is a new bibliography of titles printed at the Victoria Press. Emily Faithfull founded the Press in 1860 in order to employ women as compositors, offering an entry into the male-dominated printing trade. Presswomen printed literary anthologies, tracts, and a series of feminist periodicals, the first of which was the monthly *English Woman's Journal* (1858-1864). The anthologies and *Journal* published essays and poems by prominent female authors including Christina Rossetti, Adelaide Procter, and Isa Craig. In 1996 Margaret Beetham wrote of the Victoria Press: "This important venture in female publishing deserves a book of its own."<sup>1</sup> The book has not materialized, although chapters and articles have appeared at intervals. Scholarship is often based only on contemporary newspaper reports and scattered correspondence, since there is no known archive of the organization. This bibliography begins to fill in the archival gap. It is a product of the research for my digital project, *The Victoria Press Circle*, which recreates the social network of the press based on co-publication.

This bibliography expands on the one put forward in James Stone's *Emily Faithfull, Victorian Champion of Women's Rights*, itself based on William Fredeman's pioneering 1974 article.<sup>2</sup> It draws on research I completed in the archives of the British Library, Cambridge University, the Women's Library at the London School of Economics, and Oxford University. It adds 78 items to Stone's chronologically organized work, none of which have been previously identified as Victoria Press publications (new entries are highlighted in yellow). A glance at the bibliography reveals that Victoria Press publications, mostly pamphlets, span a surprising range of topics, from "Gourds for the Many: how to grow and cook them" (1862) to "Autobiography of a cat" (1864). Previously unrecorded Victoria Press publications include several anti-slavery

tracts published by the Ladies' London Emancipation Society (LLES), a poem by Tennyson, an essay by Florence Nightingale, and a Pre-Raphaelite satire called *Miss Scratchley: an amateur in art and crinoline*. This bibliography presents the first comprehensive effort since the advent of online catalogs to reconstruct the archive of this trailblazing feminist organization.
